DYC Short Term and Long-Range Planning and Infrastructure Committee Meeting Report (August 1, 2023)

Docks: Excellent discussion on moving forward on the ADA compliant ramps. Fred Smith-Dengler provided drawings and material estimates. Discussed doing prep work with metal framing during the winter assuming we can get volunteers. Budget for the complete project is approx. \$12,000. Would need approx. \$5000 for metal to start work this winter with the expectation to start the first ramp in early spring 2024. The board cautioned that we may need to get a building permit and that could open up other regulatory issues. Another suggestion was to build platforms instead of a ramp. Suggestion to present the project and budget to the members at the annual meeting. We tabled further discussion for the next meeting.

Bubbler System: Will need volunteers to help clean out the bubbler tubes. Suggested a redesign to the bubblers to wrap the finger docks instead of going across the slips.

Electric: Discussed a budget and project for next year to start changing electric infrastructure for west dock as an upgrade and learning experience. Project will need approximately \$8,000 budget. May present this project at the annual meeting as well.

2023 Planning: Repair docks as appropriate, evaluate bubbler system, consider eliminating aging and rotting infrastructure and docking on West dock. Make the entry to the clubhouse and docks ADA compliant through use of ramps, set up Club for remote virtual meetings, potentially set up cameras for Club member access online.

1 to 5 Year Planning: Electric upgrades, install (4) 100-amp GFCI breakers, Clubhouse upgrades, and new bathrooms. Complete ramp projects. Cosmetic and aesthetic upgrades to the Clubhouse. Consider evaluating a section of floating docks.

5 to 10 Year Planning: Replace Kitchen. Planning for more demand for electric as electric boats start affecting our club's needs.

10 to 20 Year Planning: Likely need dock surface and structure replacement project.

Race and Recreation

Vice Commodore

Majority are performing work and documenting work hours, some have accumulated more than 20 hours already. 17 members have 0 work hours recorded as of July 30th, 2023. Out of these 17 members, 14 are Senior members, and 3 are probationary.

We are now past halfway through the season, it is very important to upkeep and running of our club to getting the requisite 10 hour minimum by end of season/ closing. A final audit at the end of year will be reported to the Commodore.

A Nominating Committee was discussed for next year's candidates. The date for posting was discussed and will be forthcoming.


Unfinished Business
