

Edward D. Will November 22, 1945 – January 24, 2015

Ed Will has left us after a long and courageous battle with cancer. With his passing, DYC has lost a great member. Commodore in 1987 and a Life Member since 2004, he was the "go-to guy" when a project needed to be done at the Club. Many examples of his skill and talent are all around, from the various Club trophies he crafted, the boats he rebuilt, to the new docks which was a massive undertaking that is nearing completion. DYC Life Member Walt **Skeldon**, and three other WWII Veterans were recognized in an article by the Tampa Bay Times on Veteran's Day, Nov. 11, 2014 for their work as volunteers at the C.W. Bill Young VA Medical Center in St. Petersburg.

The article described him as one of the longest serving volunteers at the center, having been at it for 27 years. He was in the Navy for 28 years and served on aircraft carriers in the Pacific during WWII. The paper related the attack on his ship, the USS *Kadashan Bay*, by a Japanese Kamikaze in January, 1945.

Newer members wouldn't know this, but Walt has published a book about his service in the war, and in it he describes the same even, as only one who's had that experience could tell it.

The title and the theme of the article was "They keep on giving". One could really say-"Thank you for your service....still".
