

As reported last month the docks did sustain a little more damage than most years. No worries though we have persevered through much worse and the drive of the DYC will prevail.

We are looking for your help for Club Opening starting Saturday May 7th at 8 AM. All members are welcome and needed to get our clubhouse and docks back in operation for another great summer on the water. Opening tasks will include pressure washing docks (please bring your pressure washer if available), retrieval of dock ladders detached in the water, turning on and repairing water and electric, club house opening, dock repairs from ice, gin pole block and tackle, picnic table placement, pump out replacement, rebuild many dock ladders, fire protection and many more tasks that all can work on. Also, don't forget a Great Chili Lunch provided by the Damore's.

A lot of progress has started on the work barge already since the Beardsleys brought home the "Pounder" and winches from Florida. Design is complete on the derrick for the barge and much thanks already goes out to Bob Beardsley and Jim Christy for their work on the derrick. Many more thanks to all that through their ideas and structural engineering knowledge contributed to the process.

Once the Pounder and derrick are mounted to the barge and in operation there will be a select crew only that will be working on piling replacements for safety and continuity concerns which is our primary goal. This rigging and pile driving work will be very focus oriented work that will need to be safely performed by a select group of members that have done rigging and heavy lifting in the past. The safety of all of our members is the key to this successful pile-driving venture that we are undertaking.

NY Canal System set schedule for boating season

ALBANY, NY (AP) – New York's State Canal System is scheduled to open on May 1 for the 2016 season. The 524-mile system connects the Hudson River with Lake Champlain, Lake Ontario, Cayuga Lake, Seneca Lake, and Lake Erie via the Niagara River.

It includes the Erie, Champlain, Oswego, and Cayuga-Seneca canals.

According to the Canal Corp. hours of operation through May 25 will be 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., returning to that schedule again on September 8.

Hours through most of the season will be 8 a.m. to 6p.m. though many locks and lift bridges will operate on demand from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m.

Service is available around the clock for commercial vessels. Operators should call at least 24 hours in advance.
