Boater Safety Course CHAUTAUQUA COUNTY

Sheriff's Office offers boater safety courses

MAYVILLE—Four boater safety courses are scheduled for this spring, beginning May 7, by the Chautauqua County Sheriff's Office.

The state-approved classes are required to operate a personal watercraft (minimum age is 10) and for people between the ages of 10 and 18 to operate a regular motor boat.

Advance registration isn't required. The courses are free for participants younger than 18; those 18 and older must pay a\$10 fee to the state to receive a certification card.

The courses, which will run from 8 a. m. to 4 p.m. Saturdays, will be held May 7 in the Red House, 91 Frisbee Road, Cassadaga; May 14 in Southwestern Middle School, 600 Hunt Road, Jamestown; June 4 in the Hartfield Fire Department, Elmwood Drive, Mayville; and June 11 in St. Timothy's Church, 3748 Route 430, Bemus Point




