From the Archives: This feature was a regular a few years ago. Since it is our 75th year I thought it was perfect to rerun it. (This the first of articles that appeared in the Evening Observer, October 26, 1972. We thank Warren McPherson for this bit of history)

Paper On Yacht Club's History Is Written, Read By Charter Member

At the annual meeting of the Dunkirk Yacbt Club over the weekend a feature on the program was the reading of the organization's history, compiled by a charter member, Francis X. Dotterweich.

THE CLUB WAS ORGANIZED in 1936 as the Chautauqua Yacht Club. In 1938. we received an urgent letter from the Chautauqua Lake Yacht Club. Calling to our attention the conflict of names and requested that we change. Henceforth. we were known as the Dunkirk Yacht Club. At the same time we incorporated the club.

The old records are very meager. for example: "Current bills were read and approved." No mention as to what the bills were for or the amount. Or: "Correspondence was read." What correspondence? Or: "Applications for two new' members were received and accepted."Who were the new members? Also: ..Treasurer's report was read and accepted." No figures stated. I did not find an acceptable Treasurer's report until 1940.

Existed During Summer Of '36?

The first available record is that of the annual membership meeting held January 27. 1937. From its text it is evident that the club existed during the 1936 season. Now-1936 was in the midst of the depression and money was very tight. The charter members planned to have a dock erected and approached the Lake Shore National Bank-for a loan. The bank agreed to the loan of \$350 on the condition that seven or more members each sign a personal note for \$50 to guarantee the club's borrowing. Final payment on the loan was made in 1940 and the personal notes released. There is a discrepancy in the minutes in that the original loan may have been for more than \$400.

In 1936. the trolley tracks were being removed and the club acquired some of the old rail, free for the taking. Alfred (Bob) Waldorf contracted to drive the rail piles and weld thereto the rail stringers. An oak deck was constructed in sections of about five feet square. The total cost of driving of the piles and welding of the 'stringers plus the oak decking must have been less than \$350 for that was all the money the club had available.

Deck sections were removed and stored each Fall and returned to the dock in the Spring. Dr. Carter said that this was the hardest work he ever did. In the Spring of 1938, the deck sections were permanently bolted to the stringers.

Pay Up Or Stay Off

In reading the old minutes of the club. I find that somehow the club survived many trials and stormy sessions. Its problems were never resolved but reappeared each year and they are still with us today: Delinquency in the payment of dues, dock repairs, expansion of the dock, clubhouse, dock rules, harbor improvement and classification of membership. When the club was less than one year 'old, I find this dock rule: "No member be allowed the privileges of the dock until his dues *were* paid in full."

In 1936 the dues were \$2.00 for all members. In 1937 there was a reclassification of members. Dues for active members were

Active members were raised to \$5.00, while dues for inactive-and associate members remained at \$2.00. At this meeting when the dues were raised, the Rear Commodore stomped out of the meeting saying that he would refuse to pay the \$5.00 fee. It was further noted that active members had the use of the dock-whereas inactive members kept their boats at anchor. Associate members were non-boat owners. In 1938, the dues were raised to \$7.50 with an initiation fee of \$10.00 for members with boats. The dues for associate members were raised to \$2.50, subject to an initiation fee should an associate member later acquire a boat. In 1943, the regular dues for all members were raised to \$5.00, plus a dock fee of \$5.00 for boat owners. It is not clear whether the initiation fee of \$10.00 applied to both, boat owners and non-boat owners. Dues were payable to the Treasurer; but in one instance, the Commodore collected dues which he failed to forward to the Treasurer_a total of \$55.00. The directors demanded the Commodore's resignation and then booted him out of the club. The record does not show whether the club ever recovered the \$55.00. Also, we had a Secretary-Treasurer, removed from office at.mid-term, he was unreliable. There are no minutes covering this period.
